

## **Kristin Moffett, M.S.**

**Biography:** Kristin is a former neuropsychology intern in the Department of Clinical & Health Psychology at the University of Florida. She obtained her B.S. in psychology from the University of Central Florida, and her M.S. in clinical psychology from the University of Florida under the mentorship of Dr. Bruce Crosson. She is in the process of completing her Ph.D. at the University of Florida under the mentorship of Dr. Russell Bauer. In September 2015, Kristin will begin a postdoctoral fellowship at Emory University's Department of Rehabilitation Medicine.



**Research Focus:** Kristin's research interests include the neurobiological basis of cognitive and emotional impairments in adult neurological and medical populations. Her dissertation explores the cognitive and emotional sequelae of mild TBI and PTSD in veterans of the OIF and OEF conflicts, utilizing neuroimaging methods of network connectivity as predictors of symptom severity. In the future, Kristin hopes to apply this research towards the development of individually tailored neurorehabilitation interventions for individuals with traumatic brain injury.
